1. Stocks in Store: (Page 2)

- Country stocks increased to 2.94 MMT in Week 04 utilizing 56% of the system's working capacity. Space in primary elevators is good.
- Total western port terminal stocks increased to 1.39 MMT in Week 04, utilizing 72% of the working capacity. Space at Vancouver is limited.

2. Country Deliveries: (Page 3)

- Deliveries to primary elevators were 1.24 MMT in Week 04.

3. Port Performance: (Pages 3-5)

- Total western port unloads were 7% lower than the 4-week moving average and 77% higher than Week 04 last year.
- West Coast unloads were 6,098 cars (Vancouver 6,098 and Prince Rupert 0), 8% lower than the 4-week moving average and 109% higher than last year.
- Thunder Bay had 1,621 unloads, 3% lower than the 4-week moving average and 9% higher than Week 04 last year.
- Churchill is now reporting unloads, 65 in Week 04 and 66 in Week 03. Week 52 2025-26 saw the first reported unloads at Churchill since Week 13 2020-21.
- The total average terminal out-of-car time (OCT) decreased to 6.0% from 12.1% the previous week. The OCT for Week 04 was 7.4% at Vancouver and 0.0% at Thunder Bay. Prince Rupert Grain was on maintenance shutdown in Week 04.

4. Shipments: (Page 5)

- Year-to-date Western Canadian shipments from port terminal elevators at Week 04 were 54% higher than the same period last year and 20% higher than the 3-year average.

5. Vessels: (Page 5)

- Vancouver vessel lineup for Week 05 2026-27 decreased to 21 vessels (The current one-year average at Vancouver is 23 vessels). Of the 21, 7 were at berth, 9 were anchored at English Bay, and 5 were anchored at Vancouver Island.
- Prince Rupert vessel lineup for Week 05 2026-27 increased to 2 vessels (The current one-year average at Prince Rupert is 3 vessels).
- Vessels cleared from Vancouver was 13 and from Prince Rupert was 1 in Week 05 2026-27.

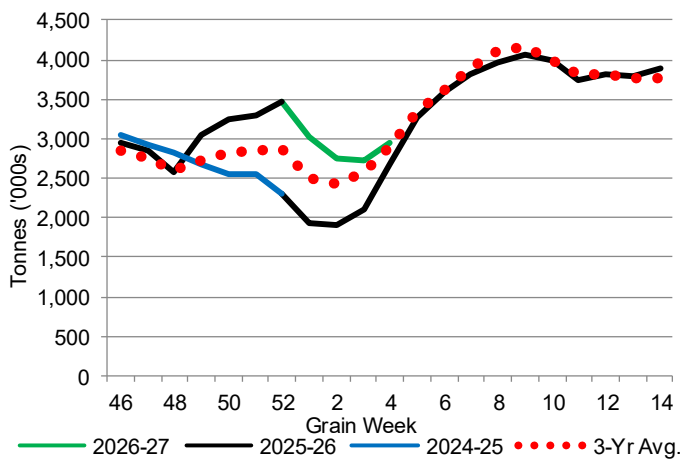

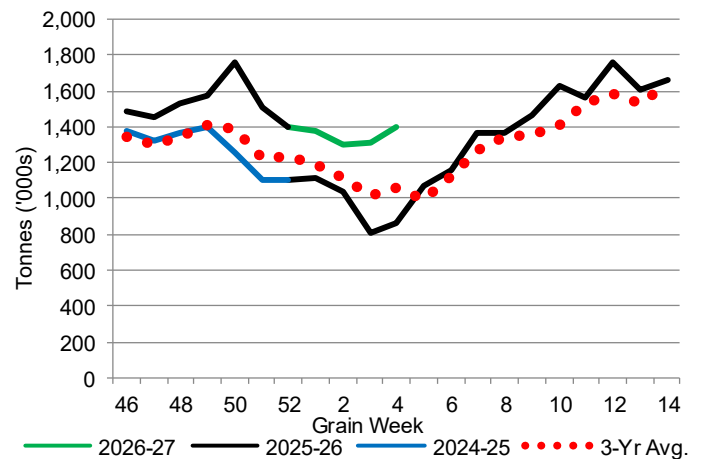

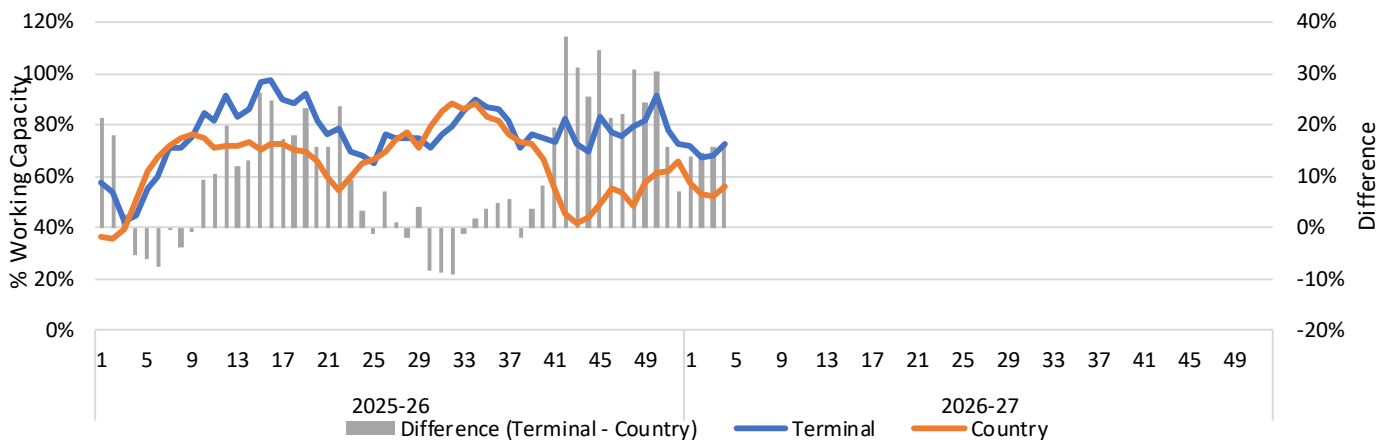
1-A2 Weekly Country Stocks in Store

1-C Weekly Stock Balance

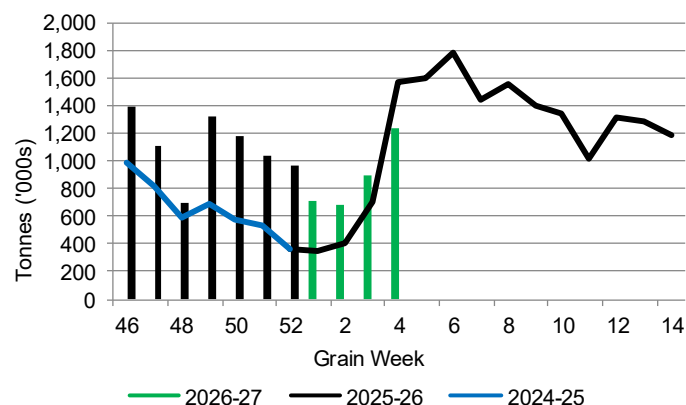

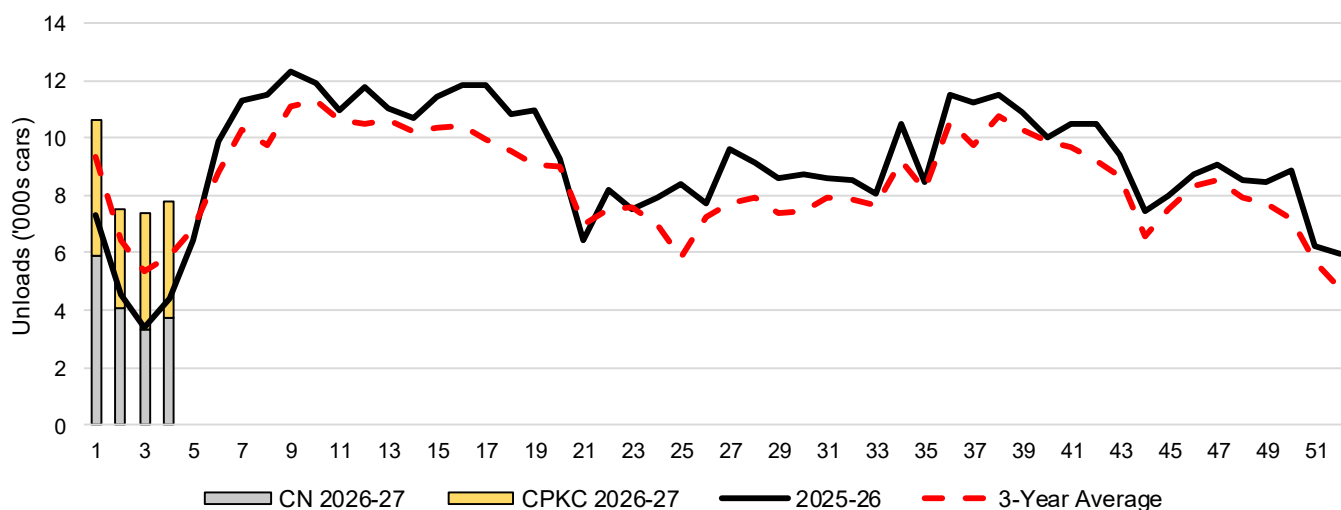

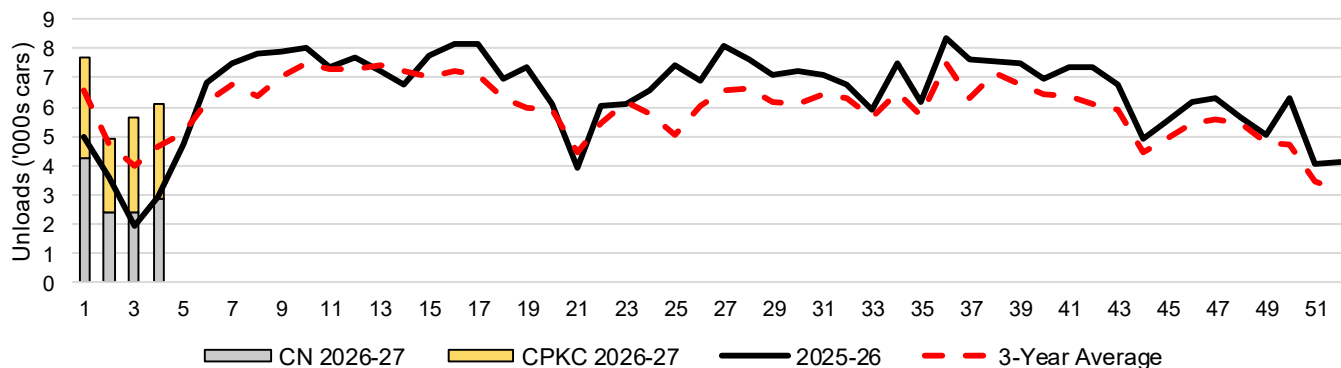

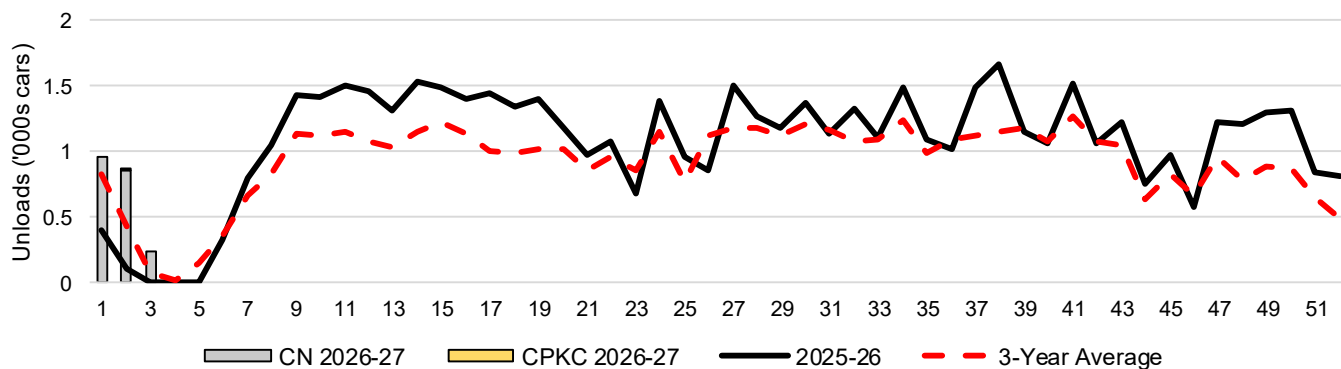
3-C Western Port Terminal Unloads (cars), Total by Carrier, This Year vs. Last Year and the 3-Year Average



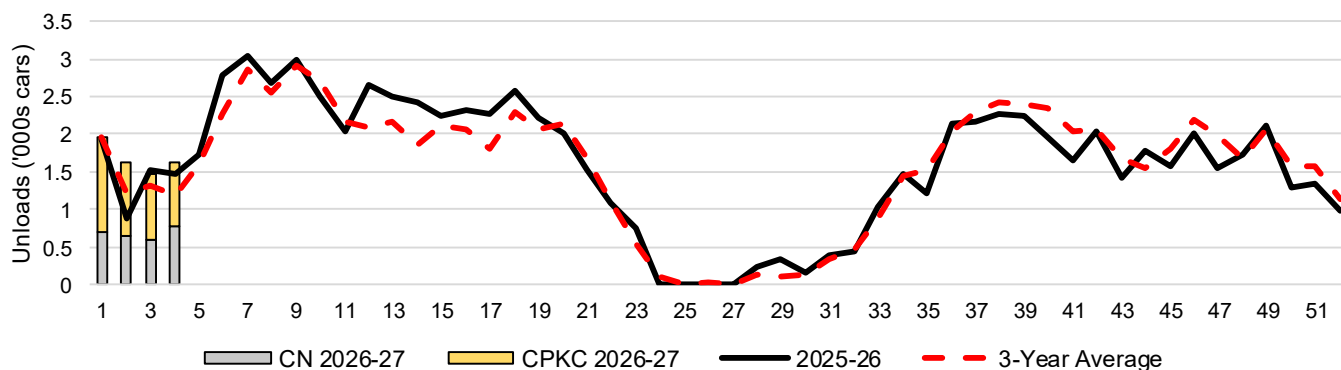
3-D Vancouver Terminal Unloads (cars), Total by Carrier, This Year vs. Last Year and the 3-Year Average



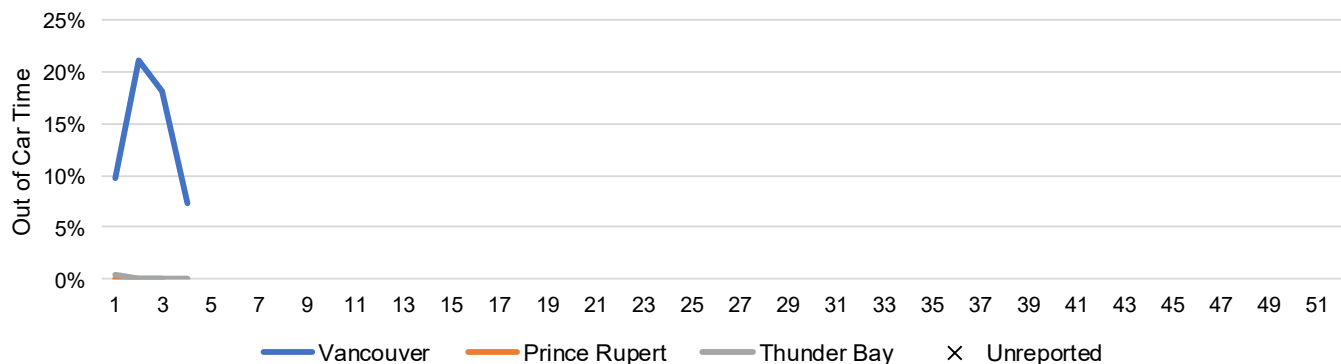
3-E Prince Rupert Terminal Unloads (cars), Total by Carrier, This Year vs. Last Year and the 3-Year Average

Out-of-car time is measured weekly and uses data from terminal elevators on the total number of hours the facilities are open & staffed (including overtime hours) and the corresponding number of hours that terminals have no railcars available to unload. The measure is expressed as a percentage (hours without cars to the total number of hours working).

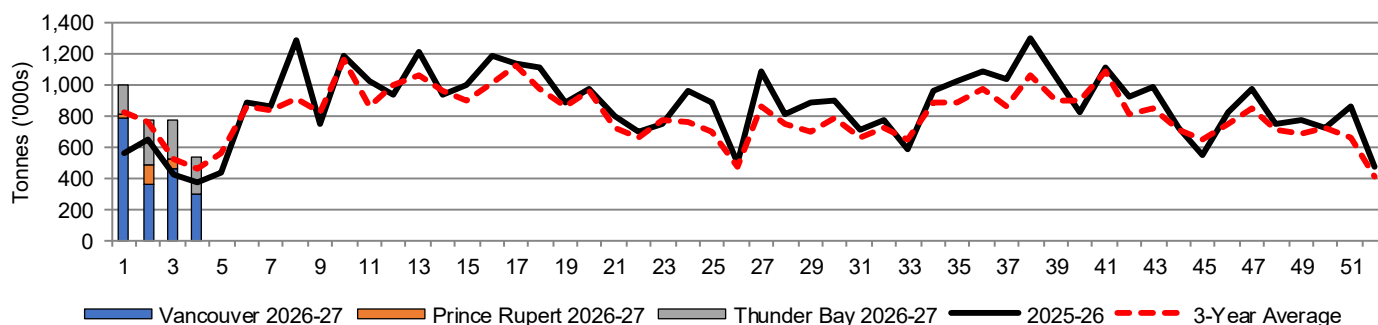

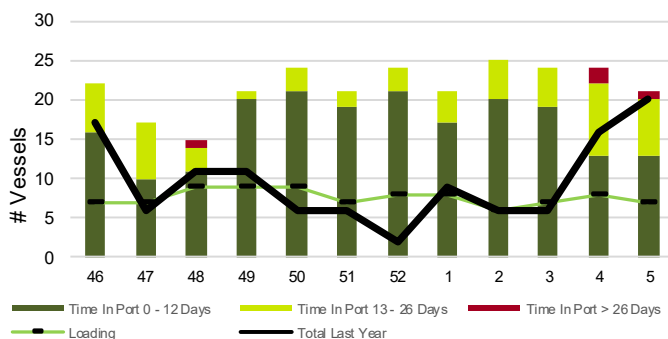

4-B Weekly Shipments ('000 tonnes) from Port Terminals – This Year vs Last Year and the 3-Year Average

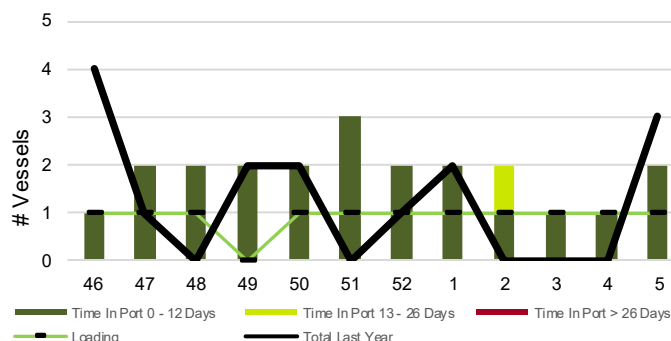

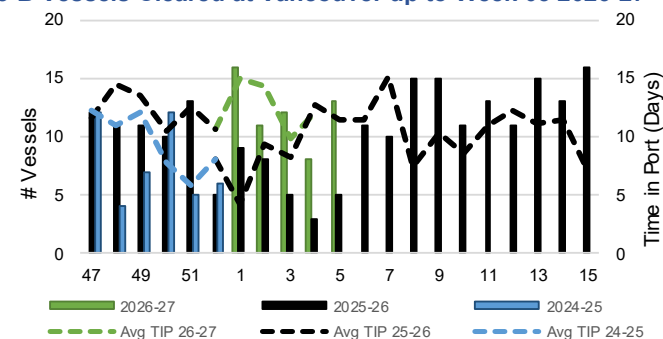
5-A Vessel Lineup at Vancouver as of Week 05 2026-27



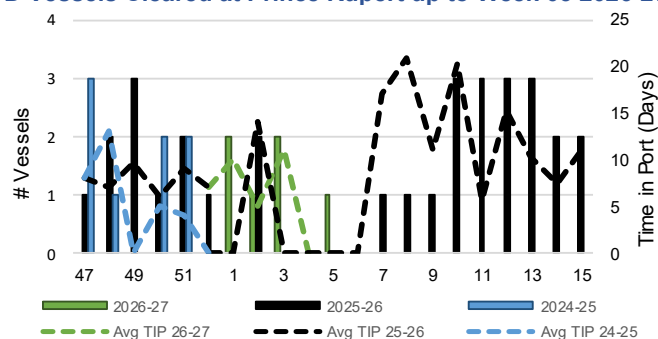
5-C Vessel Lineup at Prince Rupert as of Week 05 2026-27
